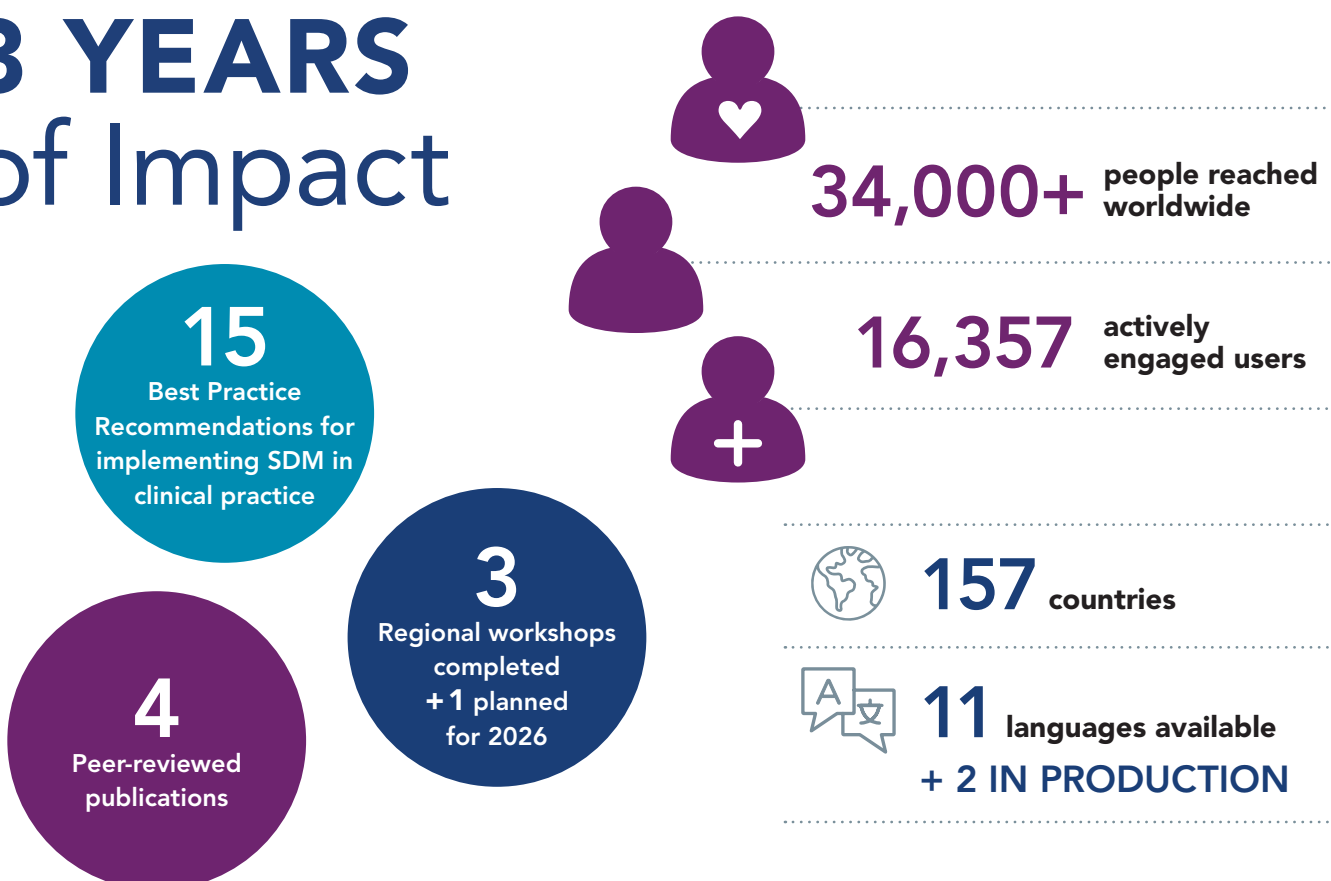


THREE YEARS OF GLOBAL IMPACT

From Decision-Support Tool to Global SDM Implementation

Since its launch in 2023, the [WFH Shared Decision-Making \(SDM\) Program](#) has evolved from a global digital decision-support tool into a broader implementation program that supports people with hemophilia (PWH), caregivers, and healthcare professionals (HCPs) in navigating an increasingly complex treatment landscape and making informed treatment decisions together.

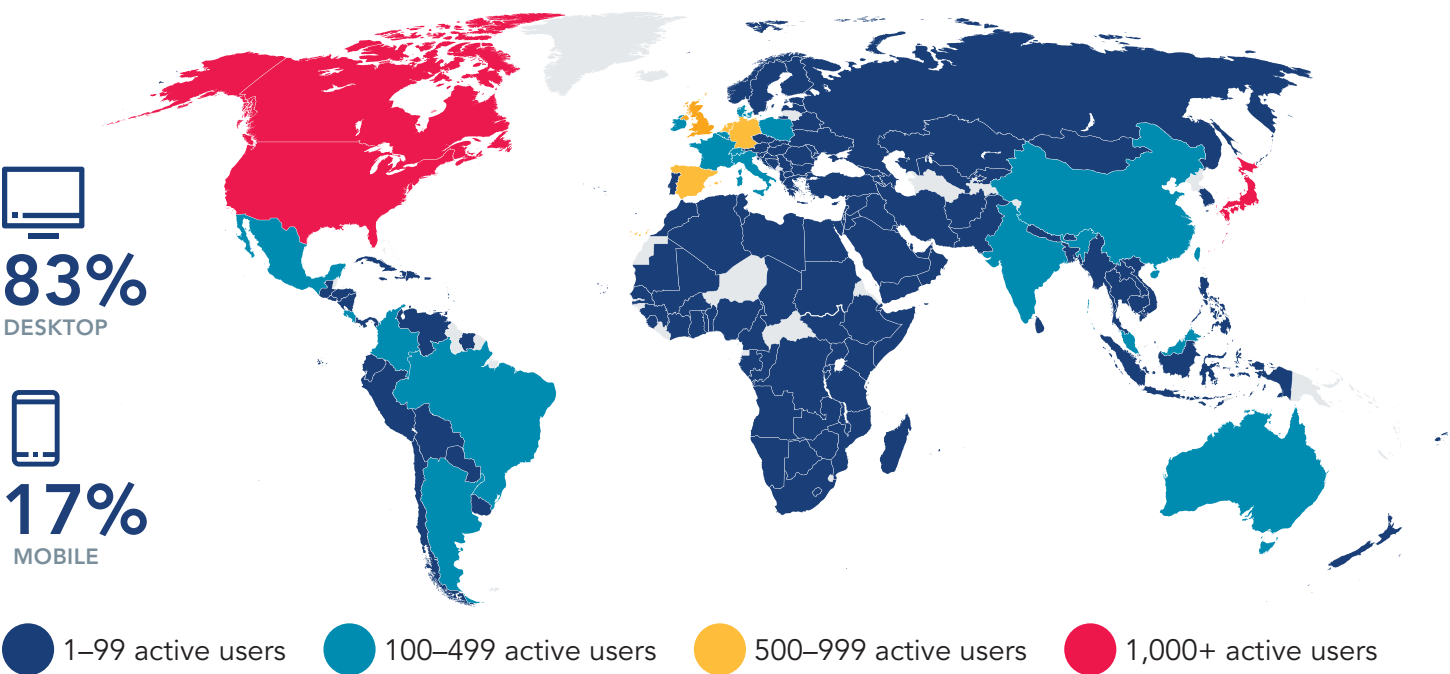
3 YEARS of Impact



Global Reach

During the first three years since launch, more than **34,000** users accessed the WFH SDM site, including **16,357** active users across **156** countries.

WFH has evaluated the impact of the SDM Tool among PWH, caregivers, and HCPs to understand how it supports treatment knowledge, communication, confidence, and shared treatment decision-making. Publication coming!

Best Practice Recommendations

15 best practice recommendations for implementing SDM in clinical practice,

developed through a rigorous, multi-stakeholder eDelphi consensus process, were published in *Haemophilia*.

Building Capacity for SDM

Regional workshops have supported PWH and HCPs in navigating increasingly complex treatment choices through shared decision-making, with activities across the Americas and Europe and expansion to Asia-Pacific in 2026.

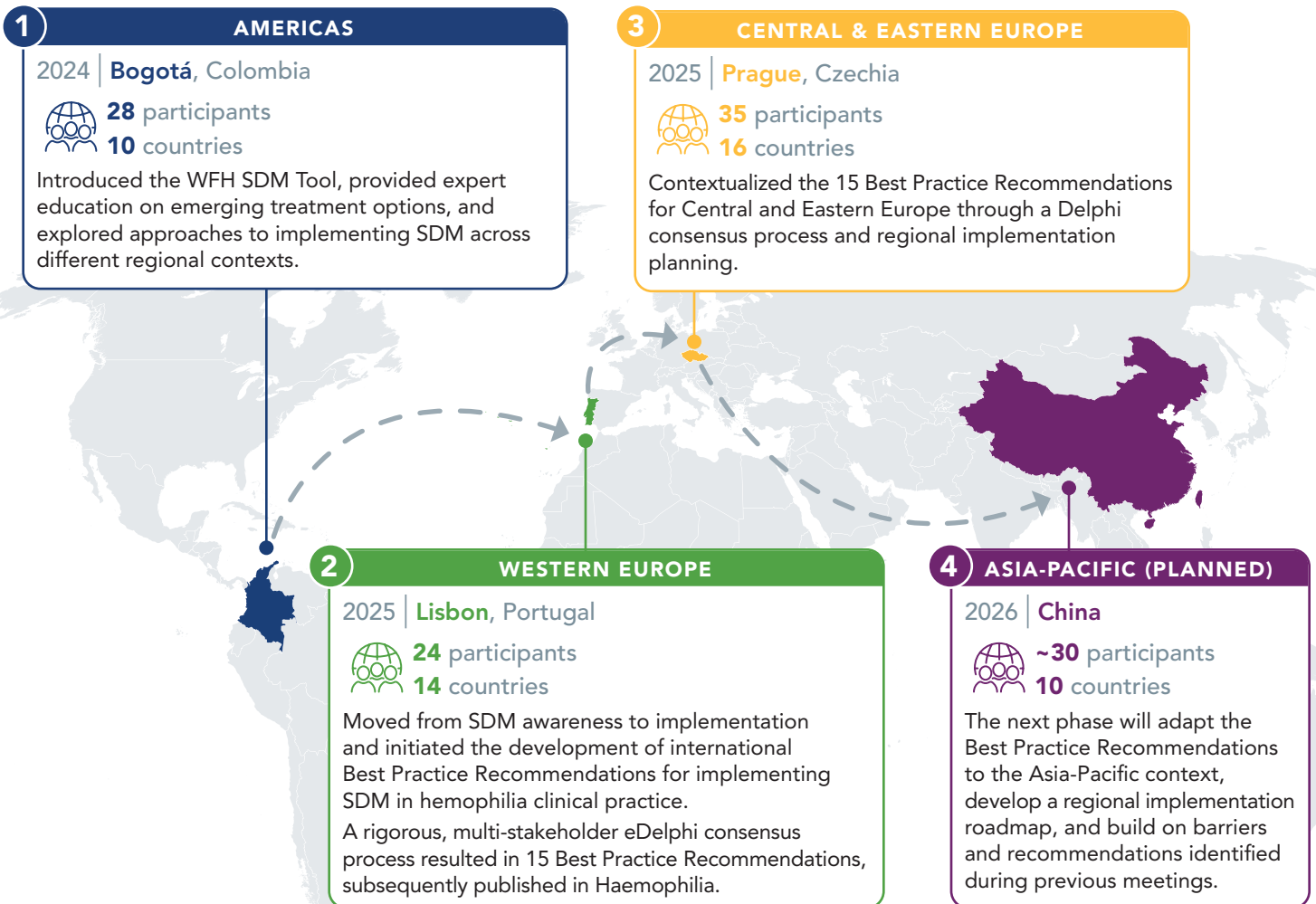
